GOAL OF THE PRESENTATION

- To lobby on Electricity Tariff Matters
- Copper Theft solutions and structures



MEMBERSHIP GROWTH

- Need to focus on recruiting membership through networking at:-
 - Conferences and events of other Associations (IURPA).
 - Meetings with Utilities and possible Affiliate members.
 - *Road show in areas where participation is low.
 - Training at Municipalities. (Need / Demand).
- Attendance at Conventions
 - Initiative to organize more Conventions .
 - Drive to increase participation at Conventions.



Managed to increase the amount of Branches and participation by Utilities

- First branch outside South Africa was established in Namibia.
- ❖ More planned in other countries plans underway for Zambia.
- The Mpumalanga branch was re-established.
- ❖ Idea to promote "Sub Branches" in areas where Utility members struggle to obtain permission to travel e.g. Northern Cape, Free State and North West.
- ☐ Changes to the Branch governance were also proposed and some branches have appointed "Champions" to assist with meetings and arrangements.
- ☐ Branch reports to be published together with the minutes in the bulletin with links to the SARPA web page in the future.



TO LOBBY ON ELECTRICITY TARIFF MATTERS

- It is important for SARPA to become a voice in the issues regarding Electricity tariffs because:-
- When tariffs increase drastically, consumers cannot survive and then tend to tamper.
- The tariffs therefore impact directly on revenue losses.
- SARPA should therefore send out the warning that high tariffs will lead to higher non-technical losses and assist with guidance regarding how to recover the losses.
- To assist Utilities with Policies, Standards and Guidelines.



<u>ACHIEVEMENTS</u>

Standards and Guidelines

- **Development of new Standards.**
 - NRS 101 (Guideline re Combating of Utility Metal Thefts)
- **Revision of guidelines completed.**
 - NRS 055 (RP Guideline) NRS 096 (Sealing) NRS 59 (Theft of earthing)
- **❖ NRS 080** still under revision (REVENUE LOSSES).
 - Huge challenge to develop a reliable guideline to calculate Revenue Losses. The aim is to assist Utilities to accurately calculate losses.
 - Pilot project in Ethekwini Municipality to develop the formula /processes.
 - Professor and Masters Student from North West University involved.



<u>ACHIEVEMENTS</u>

- Strategy to make the Toolkit available to members
- Various members collaborated to refine the toolkit.
- The aim is to convert the toolkit into an interactive web application, where Utility members can complete a questionnaire and each answer is measured according to its effectiveness in reducing losses.
- Municipalities can then decide from the results obtained, if they would like to involve SARPA further to provide guidance in this regard.



Non-ferrous Metal Thefts Reference



- Participating in the National and Regional NFMCCC forums and taking part in all operations and events organized across the country. (SAPS Training)
- Assisting SA Chamber of Commerce (SACCI) with strategic issues:-
 - Export restriction on scrap metals
 - Economic study of copper theft
 - Training needs of the metal merchant industry
 - Copper Theft Barometer
 - Getting SALGA on board with this initiative
 - Identifying a "Copper Theft Champion" (Minister)
- Non-Ferrous Conference planned in co-operation with SAPS at the Police Academy in Pretoria West in September 2013
