COURSE OBJECTIVES

The objective of this course is to highlight to participants the threat of metal theft (or as it is more commonly known "copper theft"), in order for them to understand the impact of this crime on service providers as well as their customers. This course also highlights the different types of criminals involved, their modus operandi and the challenges faced by Law Enforcement entities, identify different methods of sharing information and creating awareness while developing proactive as well as reactive best practices in order to counter such unlawful acts and in the process minimize losses.

1. MODULE 1 – THEFT OF METALS

This module focuses on the history of this crime, how to minimize losses, the effects of metal thefts on the economy of a country and the challenges of minimizing the losses.

2. MODULE 2 – HOW TO ANALYSE THE THREATS AND RISKS

This module focuses on how to minimize risks to the utility and how to understand the thief's modus operandi.

3. MODULE 3 – CRIME STRATEGY

This module focuses on the strategies to overcome the criminal acts, preventative measures, establishing internal forums, training all the role-players, interaction with Law Enforcement Agencies and the judiciary, media and community interaction.

4. MODULE 4 – INTERNAL MEASURES TO COMBAT CRIME

This module focuses on creating a “Crime Free Environment”, plus how to measure your effectiveness and utilize new technology to stop the theft.
